HOMILY

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again



in accordance the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified, he has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

Holy Thursday:

in memory of the day when Jesus Christ, our Lord, gave the mysteries of His body and blood for His disciples to celebrate.

Easter vigil to 2nd Sunday inclusive: born into the new life of water and the Holy Ghost.

Grant us your peace in this life, the peace that will turn us from final damnation,



and count us among those you have chosen. [Through Christ our Lord. Amen.]

P: Now let us – give recognition to our Lord Jesus. A-Lord you have died, Lord you have risen, Lord you are here again.



P: Now let us petition our Lord Jesus. A-Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, bring us to your glory.

P: Now let us express faith in our Lord Jesus. A-When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you return in glory.

P: Now let us give honor to our Lord Jesus. A-Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

You are the Savior of the faithful.

Father, we celebrate the memory of Christ, your Son.

We, your people and your ministers, recall his passion, his resurrection from the dead, and his ascension into glory; and through the many gifts you have given us we offer to you, God of glory and majesty, our acts of faith. We ask that they be joined with your son's holy and perfect offering that is consummated on Holy Friday and visualized in, the bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation.

Look with favor on these offerings and accept them as once you accepted the gifts of your servant Abel, the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith, and the bread and wine offered by your priest Melchisedech.

Almighty God, we pray that your angel may take our offerings to your altar in heaven to be sanctified. Then, as we receive Your Son from this altar,



let us be filled with every grace and blessing. [Through Christ our Lord. Amen.]

Remember, Father, those who have died and have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, especially those for whom we now pray, N. and N.

May these, and all who sleep in Christ, find in your presence light, happiness, and peace. [Through Christ our Lord. Amen.]

For ourselves, too, we ask some share in the fellowship of your apostles and martyrs, with John the Baptist, Stephen, Matthias, Barnabas, [Ignatius, Alexander, Marcellinus, Peter, Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anastasia] and all the saints.

Do not consider what we truly deserve, but accept our confessions of sins, and grant us your forgiveness.

We trust in your mercy and love.

Through Christ our Lord you give us all these gifts. You fill them with life and goodness, you bless them and make them holy.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
